Dear Achieve Miami Supporters,

Seventeen years ago, I walked into a Kindergarten classroom as a first-time volunteer. Those initial days spent immersed in the local school system opened my eyes to the inequality pervasive in education, and reinforced that our children deserve so much more.

Today, Achieve Miami is tackling these challenges head-on. By helping to level the playing field for children from all walks of life, empowering students from all corners of our community to help bridge socio-economic divides, and developing the next-generation of teachers, we are transforming Miami's education landscape.

As we enter our eighth year, I reflect on how we got here and, more importantly, where we are going. In 2015, we launched Achieve Miami with our inaugural Saturday literacy program that brought together high school students from one low-income public school and one private school to mentor students at a Title I elementary school in Liberty City. We were impressed with the reading gains the elementary students made in just a few months, and were pleasantly surprised by the meaningful connections formed between the high schoolers as they supported each other in their common goal of mentoring their younger peers.

From there, Achieve Miami quickly expanded its programming in response to our students' needs. We launched Achieve Scholars to bring much-needed college readiness to underserved high school students, Achieve Music to provide meaningful after-school enrichment opportunities, and Achieve Summer to reinforce connections built during the school year and prevent the dreaded "summer slide."

Achieve Miami is now in seven elementary schools and 60+ high schools, reaching thousands of kids across Miami-Dade County each year. We have six core programs that engage students from kindergarten through their first year of college. While we are proud of these early accomplishments, we are the first to acknowledge that we have more work to do!


Each year brings new victories, new challenges, new connections, and new opportunities. The pandemic challenged us to be flexible and pushed us to reimagine our work, but our commitment to our local partners never waned. Between distributing hundreds of computers to children in need, connecting tens of thousands of students to high-speed internet so they could learn remotely through our Miami Connected initiative, and distributing food to countless families, we responded to our community's needs.

And now, in response to the greatest educational challenge facing our students – the chronic teacher shortage impacting communities across our country – we are delighted to announce the launch of the Teacher Accelerator Program (TAP), an innovative collaboration between Achieve Miami, the University of Miami, and Teach For America Miami-Dade. TAP is setting out to create a pipeline that directs a new cohort of talented educators into the teaching profession, helping to ensure that Miami will never again be plagued with empty classrooms.

At Achieve Miami, we have a front row seat to the most important issue facing our community: education. Read on to learn more about who we are, what we've done, and how our partners are shaping a new path for our incredible students.

OUR PROGRAMS Achieve Miami has a vision to impact students. Currently, we have six different programs in action

programs in action.



Through our Achieve Summer program, we prevent the summer slide while creating a meaningful and joyful experience for our students. At Achieve Summer, students maintain - and even improve - their academic and social skills over summer break. For elementary students, our high quality summer program combines rigorous academics, meaningful mentorship, and exciting enrichment opportunities, all infused with summer camp energy. Transformative learning, meaningful connections, and lessons which build on students' individual and cultural experiences make the program feel like fun and games. High school volunteers and paid summer interns obtain valuable leadership, presentation, and mentorship skills, while teachers engage in daily professional development.

Every participant- from the youngest elementary student to the high school volunteer to the teacher and the site directorexperiences meaningful personal, professional, and academic growth.



Underserved elementary students (who may otherwise be left behind), surge ahead in their reading, writing, and presentation skills at Achieve Saturdays. Twice a month, a diverse group of high school student volunteers from across Miami-Dade come together at four elementary school sites to read, write, and connect with underserved elementary students. Students' academic accomplishment, well-being, and social-emotional skills soar, especially when paired with a high school "Big Buddy" who serves as a nurturing mentor who inspires and motivates their "Little Buddy." The high school student volunteers acquire leadership experience, strengthen their communication skills, build their empathy, and connect with peers from different neighborhoods and backgrounds as they join together in a common mission to make a positive and long-lasting difference in the lives of the little kids and their communities.














Music is unique because it demands focus, critical thinking, and vision while promoting creativity and individualism. In the Achieve Music program, students realize their full potential through the power of music. Achieve Music educates over 200 public 2nd to 6th grade elementary students through daily after-school programming in band, voice, percussion, and music theory. Students not only develop skills in playing an instrument, reading music, and working with an ensemble, they also increase their self-control, confidence, listening skills, and verbal intelligence.



Many talk about the path to success; we take students by the hand and lead them along it. Each year, 200+ high school sophomores and juniors receive personalized guidance on college admissions and enrollment through our Achieve Scholars program. Students benefit from intensive academic advising and college planning, college application assistance, financial aid and scholarship application assistance, test preparation resources, and more. Our leadership trainings develop our students' foundational career-readiness skills and "soft" skills such as critical thinking, creative problem solving, teamwork, and written and oral communication. Once students graduate and move on to their colleges or post-secondary opportunities, we transition them into the Achieve Alumni program.



We recognize that the first year in college, the bridge between childhood and adulthood, can be stressful, especially for many of our students who are first-generation college students. With this understanding, we stay present for our graduates of Achieve Scholars, scaffolding them with the support they need to make decisions and take on the full responsibility that comes with being a college student. Students in our Achieve Alumni programs engage in a series of workshops and one-on-one mentorship which empower them to successfully navigate this critical first year of college. Workshops we offer include College Life, Financial Literacy, Campus Resources 101, Sexual Health, Mental Health, Defining Your Major, Study Abroad, and Preparing for Summer.

We bring together diverse high school students from across Miami to connect, communicate, and collaborate to improve their Greater Miami community. The Achieve Club offers a wide variety of meaningful community service and leadership opportunities that directly impact underserved elementary students in Miami. Achieve Club members are exposed to new people and ideas while given significant responsibility and support, helping them to become thoughtful and inclusive leaders, as well as engaged citizens and advocates.

Anthony served as a dedicated Big Buddy volunteer and Achieve Scholar, immensely growing academically and personally through his involvement with Achieve Miami.

I am a senior at Robert Morgan Educational Center and an Achieve Scholar. Growing up in Cuba made me the fighter that I am today. To create a better future for me and my family, my parents and I immigrated to the United States when I was 9 years old-leaving everything I knew behind.

As a native Spanish speaker, the language differences made my academic life extremely hard. For years I was considered below average, I received little to no help from teachers, and only rejection and judgment from classmates. I did not have any friends, and having to sit alone during lunch destroyed my confidence. Luckily, I was fortunate enough to be introduced to Achieve Miami.

As an Achieve Scholar, I was able to participate in free ACT tutoring - something my family could not afford. I learned what was needed to prepare for college and how to apply for financial aid. My success coach helped me with writing my personal statement and resume. I was given access to opportunities and knowledge I would not have found on my own. The Achieve Scholars program helped to develop my skills and confidence because I was able to interact with my peers without feeling judged. Because of this, I was allowed to participate in an internship this past summer working in the clinic Open Door Health Center.

I am now able to follow my dreams in the top 10% of my graduating class. I was chosen as a Posse Scholarship Finalist and I have already received an acceptance from FIU. Achieve Miami has helped me immensely through my high school career process, and for that, I will forever be grateful.




ACHIEVE FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Last year marked another year of fiscal health and growth for Achieve Miami. Revenue totaled the highest annual amount raised to date.


Our financial strength enables us to provide meaningful educational experiences to close opportunity gaps for students throughout Miami-Dade County.



Little Buddies, our elementary school students from underserved neighborhoods, participate in the Summer, Saturdays, and Music programs.




HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS = BIG BUDDIES

Jordan volunteered with Achieve Miami from 8th-12th grade. After working with underserved students and helping to develop their literacy skills, he quickly became aware of the struggles our students face and was inspired to do even more. He fundraised and recruited for Achieve, organized countless community-wide book drives, and assisted in multiple food distributions during the pandemic.

Two years ago, the rising fourth grade class at one Achieve Summer site decided to help their community by creating an edible garden and sharing the fruits, vegetables, and herbs with their neighborhood. The school principal was so excited about the project that she started a gardening club at the school to keep the program going throughout the year. The garden is still thriving

When schools shut down due to Covid, Oscar started attending virtual Achieve programming. He was a third grader and a recent immigrant who spoke very little English. Even with other Spanish speaking Littles and Bigs, 1-1 breakouts, and other supports, he was very withdrawn and did not speak much. After one short year with Achieve, Oscar has grown tremendously, becoming an active participant and excelling in reading and writing in English!

FUTURE IMPACT Since its founding in 2015, Achieve Miami has continuously improved its programs and processes based on data-driven evaluation of what works best for our students. We will broaden our impact by increasing our programmatic presence in the communities we already serve and create additional opportunities for future students.

Expand our existing programs in intensity and scope - for example by increasing music education from two days to five days per week within current school locations, and by expanding programs to new partner schools.

Continue developing strategic partnerships with like-minded organizations to dramatically increase Achieve Miami's impact. For example, we are thrilled about the launch of the Teacher Accelerator Program, a groundbreaking collaboration between Achieve Miami, the University of Miami, and Teach For America, to address the teacher shortage.

Leverage the expertise and unique experiences of our community partners to bring a wider range of resources to set our kids up for success.

We hope to continue expanding the reach of Achieve Miami to impact as many young lives as possible, but we cannot do it without your ongoing commitment and support. Education is key to opportunity and every child has a right to reach their full potential! The need is great.
